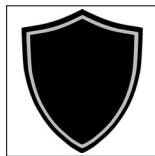


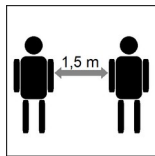
Hygiene concept

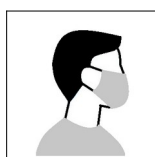
Do you feel healthy?

As a participant of the tournament, you undertake to take care of your health. If you have symptoms of illness, you do not appear at the venue and call the tournament management.



Minimum distance 1.5 meters

A minimum distance of 1.5 meters should be maintained between the participants. Avoid clusters in door areas and bottlenecks by walking slowly or waiting ahead. The minimum distance on the board cannot be maintained.



Mask requirement in the tournament area

Without exception, every participant must wear a mask in the entire tournament area. The mask must cover your **mouth and nose!** Any violation of this rule can result in loss of the game and immediate exclusion from the tournament.



Wash and disinfect hands

The hands should be cleaned regularly and often disinfected so as not to represent a transmission surface for viruses.



Don't shake hands

Shaking hands is not permitted. At the beginning of the game you can alternatively nod your head and to end a game of chess you simply stop the clock.



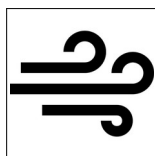
No watching

In order to be able to keep the prescribed minimum distance, walking around and looking at other boards is not allowed. The players may only leave their board to go to the toilet, for a break in the fresh air or to get a drink. Visitors are not admitted to the tournament.



No analysis

Unfortunately there is no analysis room this year so that as little time as possible is spent falling below the minimum distance. Analysis in the gaming room is prohibited. The players should leave the tournament hall quickly after the end of the game.



Fresh air

During the round, an air conditioning system ensures a supply of fresh air. Ventilation takes place between the rounds. Please think of warm clothing, as the tournament hall can cool down by ventilating it during the round.
